The economic context

- Public expenditure is 19% of EU GDP
- World Bank estimates that eProc can trigger savings between 6 and 13.5% of total public procurement
- eProc will contribute in terms of fiscal consolidation

The Commission fosters eProc

1. Communication on "end-to-end eProcurement"
2. The new PP Directives
3. The new eInvoice Directive
4. The Digital Single Market Strategy (DSM)

1. Com "end-to-end eProcurement"

- Communication from the Commission from 2013
- Is about transition to full eProcurement
- Covers pre-award and post-award
- Opportunity re-think procurement processes

2. The new PP Directives

- Published end of March 2014
- Makes eProc mandatory for PP in 2018
- Has more "e" elements in it
 - **eNotices, eAccess, eSubmission**
 - **eCertis, ESPD (Electronic Single Procurement Document)**

3. The new eInvoice Directive

- All public authorities must allow receipt of eInvoices by 2020 if compliant to the EU standard
- New European eInvoicing standard by CEN
 - **Based on existing standards**
 - **3 Years**

4. The Digital Single Market

- Recognises that ICT is the foundation of modern economic systems
- Public procurement plays an important role in promoting standards and interoperability
- Ambition to accelerate Member States' transition towards e-procurement and adoption of the OOP

The eInvoice Directive

- "Directive 2014/55/EU of the European Parliament and of the Council of 16 April 2014 on electronic invoicing in public procurement"
- Political agreement reached on 16 April 2014
- Published in the Official Journal on 6 May 2014

Objectives of eInvoice Directive

- Eliminate barriers in the Single Market
- Facilitate use of e-invoicing and create new business opportunities for enterprises
- Generate savings for administrations and businesses and help reduce payment processing times

"Predominant mode of invoicing in the EU by 2020"

Key elements of the Directive (1)

- Scope:
 - **Only invoices covered by Public Procurement Directives**
 - **Only invoices submitted to the public sector**
 - **Covers all public authorities (national, regional, local)**
- New European e-invoicing standard (EN) to be developed and tested by CEN
 - **“semantic data model for a core electronic invoice”**

Key elements of the Directive (2)

- Most important:
 - **“Contracting authorities and contracting entities are obliged to accept electronic invoices compliant with the new standard”**

European standard for eInvoice

- The new standard (EN) will:
 - **build on existing specifications developed by CEN, UN/CEFACT, ISO, and other relevant e-invoicing systems and specifications**
 - **not replace existing e-invoicing standards – national systems can continue to be used**
 - **be compliant with provisions of Directive 2006/112/EC (VAT Directive)**
 - **be compatible with international standards**
 - **be adapted for use in B2B sector**
 - **take into consideration needs of SMEs and sub-central CAs**

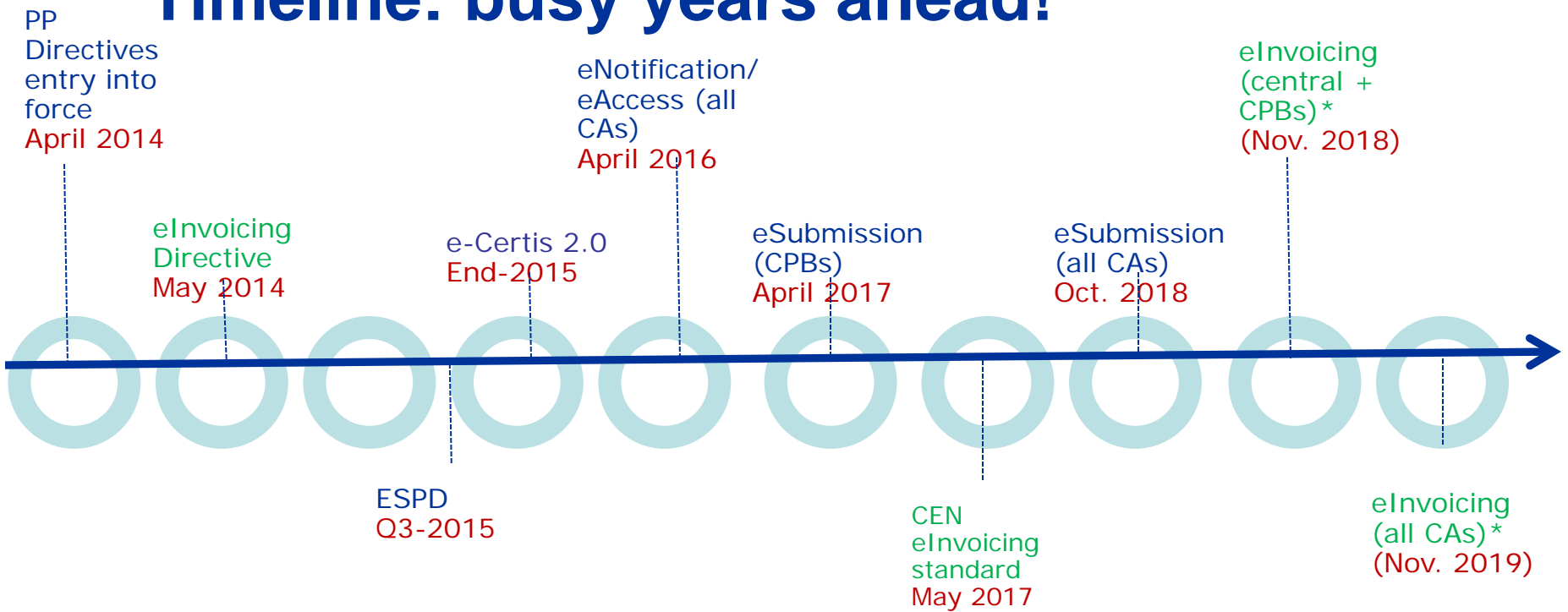
Additional deliverables from CEN

- Ancillary standardisation deliverables:
 - **Limited list of syntaxes**
 - **Related syntax bindings**
 - **Recommendations on transmission interoperability**
- Ancillary deliverables will not be part of the EN
- BUT:
 - **CAs/CEs will be obliged to receive and process e-invoices sent in the EN and any of the syntaxes on the limited list**

Timetable

- Standardisation request to CEN: Q3 2014
 - **Publication of the EN at the latest within 36 months**
- Implementation:
 - **CAs and CEs must be able to receive and process electronic invoices that comply with the standard by 27 November 2018 respectively 2019**
- BUT:
 - **Minimum of 18 months from the publication of the EN in the Publication Office**
 - **Possibility to postpone deadline for regional and local authorities for a further 12 months**

Timeline: busy years ahead!

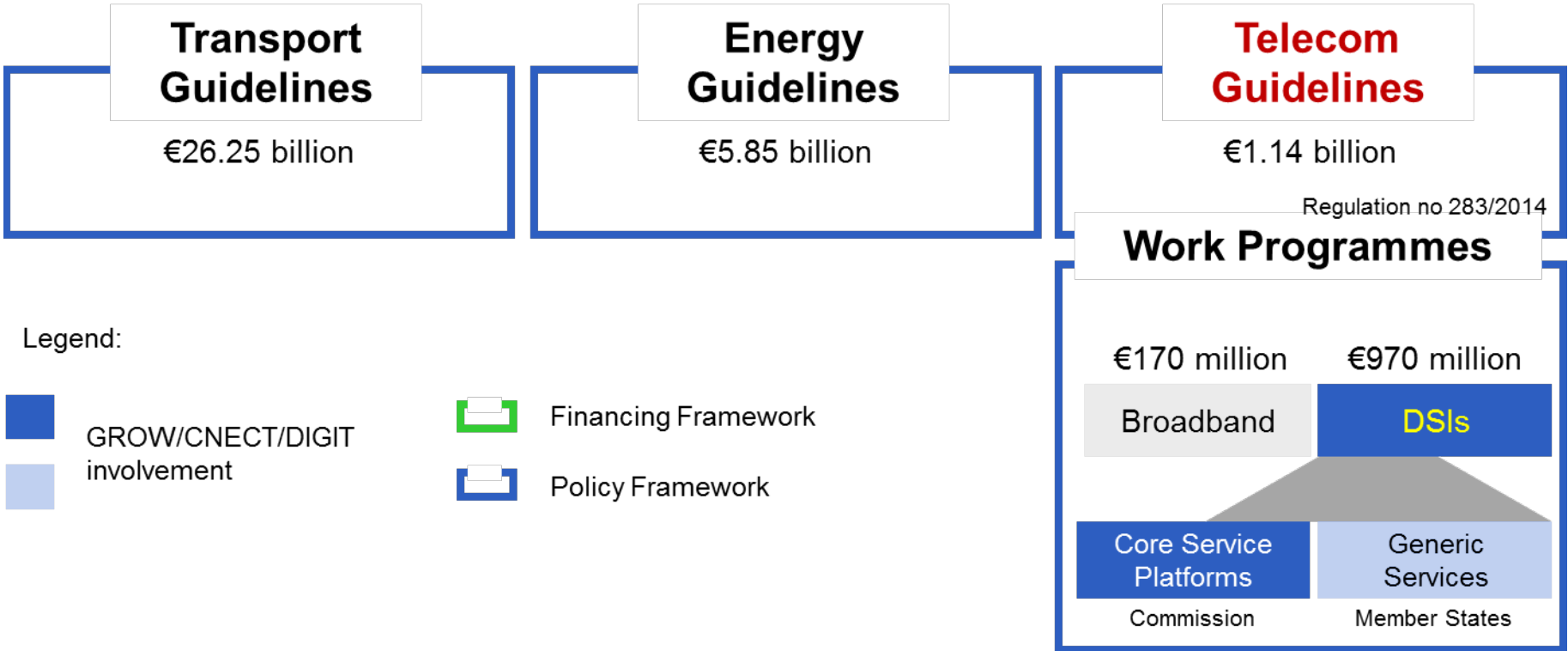

CEF eInvoicing DSI Goal

- To support the uptake of the receiving of electronic invoices in Europe
- To support solution/service providers to implement the EN and its list of syntaxes
- Not replace existing eInvoicing standards – national systems can continue to be used

eInvoicing Call 2015

- Actions
 - **Support implementation of eInvoice solutions**
 - **Specially on regional and local level**
- Must be
 - **Preferably based on CEN MUG and CEN BII**
 - **And which take results of European large scale pilot projects into account**
 - **As well solutions which are based on EU or international standards, if they envisage compliance with the future EN**

Financial support

- EUR 7 million
- Consortia consisting of at least 5 entities from one or more Member State(s) composed of public or private entities (at least half should be public)
- Duration: 1 year
- Co-financing rate: 75 %
- Call for proposals deadline: January 2016

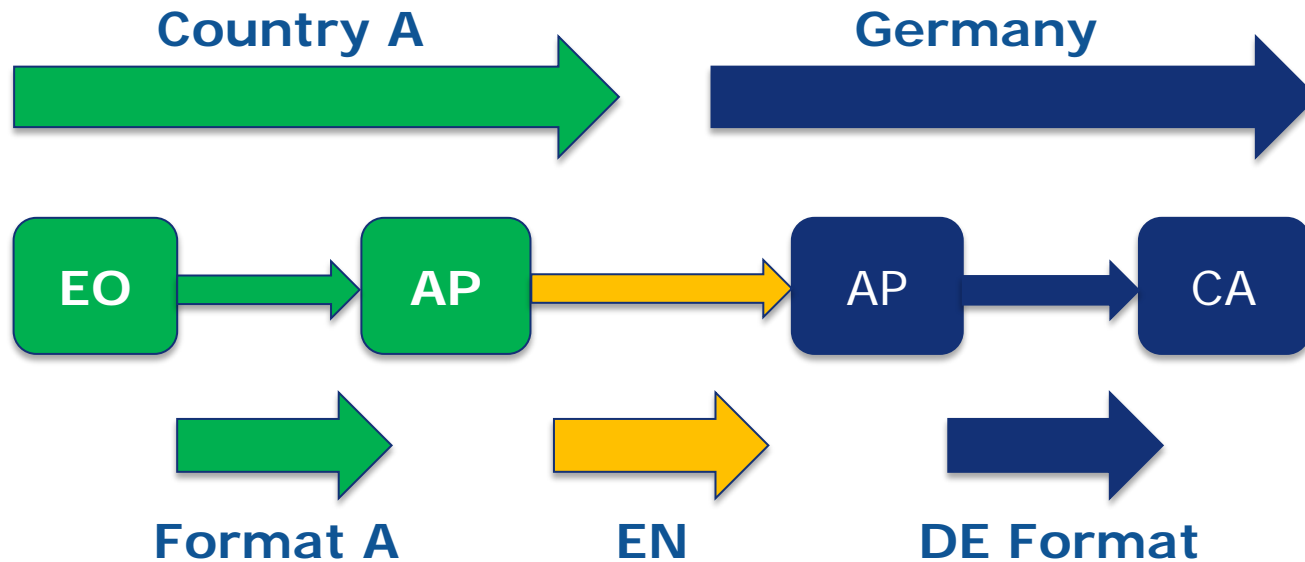
CEF eDelivery DSI

- Actions
 - **Setup of eDelivery Access Points**
- Financial support
 - **EUR 1 million**
 - **Consortia consisting of at least 5 entities from one or more Member State(s) composed of public or private entities**
 - **Co-financing rate: 75 %**
 - **Duration: 1 year**

- *Opening date: 21 October 2015*
- *Closing date: 19 January 2016, at 17:00, Brussels local time*
- *Indicative budget: EUR 38.5 million*

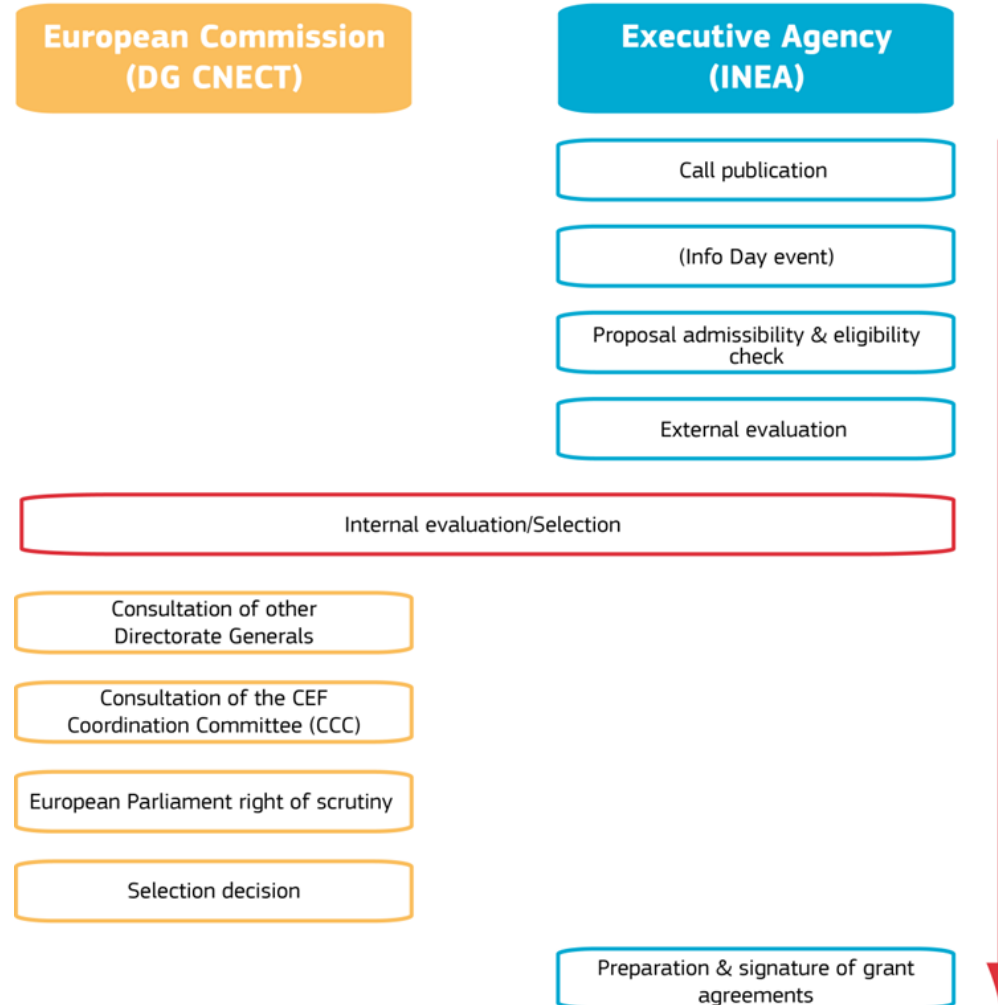


CEF eDelivery DSI: AP (Access point)
